

How can I create a safe password to use online?	password, personal information, blog, permission, vlogs, appropriate, internet, website, spoof, verify, reputable source, inappropriate, permission	<p>There are some basic rules you can follow to create a really strong password.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Include both lower-case (abc) and upper-case (ABC) letters. ✓ Include numbers (123). ✓ Include other characters (like punctuation marks and symbols), e.g. ?&#£\$!@ ✓ Avoid using full words. ✓ Avoid using names or birthdays. 	Describe what makes a good password to use on the internet?
Is everything I read online true?		<p>Not everything we read on the Internet is true.</p> <p>If we're not sure, there are certain ways to check.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> We could ask the person who wrote it, if this is possible. If you want to know if something is true, it's fine to ask. We could talk about it with a trusted adult and ask them to help us. We could check the facts with a reliable website. If a well-known charity or organisation has been named in the information, this is really good sign! <p>There are many 'spoof' or 'fake' websites.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the person writing the information may have made a mistake; • someone may be writing something false to play a joke; • what we are reading may be trying to make us believe false information on purpose.
