What are the trade links between El Salvador and the UK?		<p>Imported from El Salvador</p>  <p>coffee, cotton, sugar, fruit and nuts, shrimp</p>		
What is fair trade?		<p>Goods the UK imports: coffee beans, bananas, medicines, aircraft, cars, oil and gas.</p> <p>Fair trade also supports:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • protecting the environment • training for farmers • protecting workers' rights • protecting payment of the Fairtrade Minimum Price • payment of an additional Fairtrade Premium to invest in business or community projects 		
What is the global supply chain?		<p>Global Supply Chain</p>  <p>Bananas are grown on plantations in the Windward Islands. → Bananas are picked and packed. → Bananas are shipped to a ripening centre in Europe. → Bananas are transported by lorry to a supermarket.</p>		
How has trading changed?		<p>How trade has changed over</p>  <p>Tudor Era (sailing ship, horse-drawn cart) → Victorian Era (steamship, train) → Today (container ship, truck)</p>
