### Key Question: Why was the Victorian Era a time of powerful change?

Previous Knowledge - We would expect children to already be able to:

- ...name some of the changes that took place that would have put Britain on the map with the rest of the world.

- ...explain how this period of time put Britain on the map with the rest of the world.

- Some children will have gone beyond the expected level and will show that they are **exceeding** because they can:
- ...define what the Industrial Revolution was and why it is an important point in history.
- ...name a selection of important inventions that came from the Victorian era and how they are still influencing our lives today.
- ...describe how Britain's landscape changed during this period and describe some of the positives and negatives of this.
- ...name important inventors and artists from the period, describing the impact that they had at the time as well as the impact they continue to have now.
- ...explain how transport links were improved.
- ...explain what the Great Exhibition was and how the effect it had on the global community?
- ...explain how this period of time put Britain on the map with the rest of the world, with an appreciation of the positives and negatives of this.
