Key Question: Incarnation: Was Jesus the Messiah?

...weigh up how far the idea that Jesus the Messiah – a Saviour for God – is important in the world today and, if true, what difference that might make in people's lives. Some children will have gone beyond the expected level and will show that they are **exceeding** because they can:

...explain in depth the place of Incarnation and Messiah within the 'big story' of the Bible.

...identify Gospel and prophecy texts, using technical terms, drawing on these to make connections and conclusions.

...identify and explain connections between biblical texts, Incarnation and the Messiah, using theological terms. ...show how Christians put their beliefs about Jesus' Incarnation into practice in different ways in celebration Christmas. Compare and contrast different views of Christians at Christmas.

...comment on how the idea of Jesus is the Messiah make sense in the wider story of the Bible, drawing on evidence from previous units of work.

...weigh up how far the idea that Jesus the Messiah – a Saviour for God – is important in the world today and, if true, what difference that might make in people's lives, giving examples of this.
