Children at the expected level of development will: Talk about the lives of the people around them and their roles in society Know some similarities and differences between things in the past and now, drawing on their experiences and what has been read in class Understand the past through settings, characters and events encountered in books read in class and storytelling. Explore local castles (Ludlow, Brampton Bryan, Wigmore) and compare them to buildings now. Explore local dastles or viewed in class and storytelling. Draw and discuss parts of our school and village, looking at evidence of whether they are old and new. Compare housing in the village of Leintwardine and see if we can identify a timeline of houses. Be involved in local events e.g. attending the war memorial during Remembrance Day. Visit the quarry to look for fossils.	Compare photographs of ourselves as labies to now. Discuss and explore our own lives and experiences we have had in the past e.g. alking about family celebrations. Creating a family tree. Discuss and compare toys we played with and toys our great grandparents had. Ordering daily timetables and routines. Discring changes over time when exploring lifecycles of a butterfly or frog. Discring lifecycles of a butterfly or frog. Discring local places in Leintwardine and exploring the history of them. Discussing homes, transport and schools from the past, comparing them to present lay. Discring louses and castles in the onstruction area. Demembrance Day activities and visiting he war memorial. Experiencing activities based on Bonfire light, discussing Guy Fawkes. Talk about significant people e.g. Mary anning and Neil Armstrong. Discussing and learning about dinosaurs, possils and other extinct animals. Listen to stories based on the past. Learning traditional tales and nursery hymes. Looking at traditional tales and dentifying the roles of Kings, Queens and Cingdoms. Lon-fiction books in provision to explore distorical facts.
