Written statement of behaviour principles

- Every pupil understands they have the right to feel safe, valued and respected, and to learn free from the disruption of others;
- The school's policies and behaviour reflect its link with the Church of England, and as such are rooted in love, compassion, mutual respect and inclusion;
- All pupils, staff and visitors are free from any form of discrimination;
- Staff and volunteers set an excellent example to pupils at all times;
- Rewards, sanctions and reasonable force are used consistently by staff, in line with the behaviour policy;
- The behaviour policy is understood by pupils and staff;
- The exclusions policy explains that exclusions will only be used as a last resort, and outlines the processes involved in permanent and fixed-term exclusions;
- Parents are aware of the 'Home School Agreement' and sign a copy of this when their child starts school.
- Pupils are helped to take responsibility for their actions;
- Families are involved in behaviour incidents, to foster good relationships between the school and pupils' home life.

The governing board also emphasises that violence or threatening behaviour will not be tolerated in any circumstances.

This written statement of behaviour principles is reviewed and approved by the Full Governing Body every academic year.
