### Our School

Set in the historic village of Leintwardine in the heart of the countryside, our school offers an idyllic and inspiring start to a child's education.

Leintwardine Primary School enjoys a long and productive history. The school was originally funded and endowed by the Hon. Edward Harley in 1659. The present school was built in 1973 and was further expanded in 2008 when our Nursery, run as a Community Interest Company, was opened.

The school has 4 classrooms, a spacious central practical area and library and large school hall.

In 2020 we added the Learning Pod to our school

teaching spaces to enable even wider opportunities.

Each class is well equipped with computers and an interactive whiteboard. Suites of laptop computers and a class set of iPads add to our ICT resources.

Our grounds are attractively landscaped, with a

traditional playground, an adventure play area, tyre park,

quiet areas with seating, a large playing field and other areas developed as gardens for vegetables and wildlife. The views from our school are idyllic.

We are of course always happy to welcome children who have come from other settings too. We are keen to meet children in their Nursery settings and provide a comprehensive transition into Reception so please get in touch with us as soon as possible to let us know that you intend to start your child with us in Reception.

### Partnership with Parents

#### **School Ambassadors**

Year 6 children are encouraged each year to apply to be an ambassador

Ambassadors take on responsibilities across school that include - representing the school at events, answering the telephone over the lunch break, showing visitors around school, helping the headteacher and leading by example.



#### **School Council**

We have an active School Council, with children voted is demacratically at the begining of each school year to represent their year group. Reception are represented by a year 6 pupil who attends meetings, often with a Reception child.

The School Council meets regularly to discuss how they would like to enhance school life and to raise any issues brought to them by their classmates.

#### **Vision Leaders**

Our Vision leaders are children who volunteer themselves to take on additional responsibilities during Collecive Worship an in all aspects of school to ensure that we are - 'Lefting Our Light Shine'

They have led harvest services, organised reflection time in the Learning Pod at luchtime and have led a mindfulness activity group.



#### **Digital Leaders**

Digital leaders are children that show interest in technology across school. They are keen to assist teachers and their peers and are fantastic role-models in digital technology. They attend Digital leader training sessions where they meet up with digital leaders from other Primary Schools and have been asked to present their work at conferences. ### Teaching and Learning

Our curriculum is based on statutory requirements and we ensure that the children are taught the full range of Primary School subjects including French.

The children are taught in mixed age, mixed ability classes. Within the classes, the teachers have the flexibility to teach them as a class, a year group, an ability group or as an individual according to the circumstances.

We use ICT across all subject areas and actively seek opportunities to link subjects.

We use our outside environments to promote active and outdoor learning where possible.

The school is always happy to provide parents with more detailed information about the curriculum, please take a look at the Curriculum section of our wesite for more information on resources and schemes used in school.

#### Homework

Homework is an important aspect of a child's education and can be a significant factor in raising attainment. It gives children a chance to consolidate and practise what has been learnt in class. We set homework on a regular basis and encourage the children to become increasingly independent learners as they move up through the school.

We readily acknowledge, however, that play and free time have a vital role in a child's growth and development and we try to ensure that homework does not prevent children from taking part in after school clubs and other activities that play an important part in children's lives.





### At the Heart of our Community

Leintwardine School is important in the life of our village, but also has strong links with the wider community. Our school has a close relationship with St Mary's Church, Leintwardine; the Vicar takes a weekly 'worship time' in school and the children lead services at the church for Harvest, Christmas and Easter. These are particularly joyous event to which parents and the local community are invited.

Local people are involved with the school on a number of levels. Governors and school staff all come from very close by. We regularly invite local people in to give talks and share their knowledge and skills with the children. We are very fortunate to live in an area rich in talent and have hosted visits from local artists, writers, historians and musicians











### Our Wider School Community

We have an international link with Nganana Primary School in Tanzania. The children write to each other regularly, sending stories, pictures and sharing interests such as football! Through a Connecting Classrooms project funded by the British Council, both schools have been working on similar whole school projects which are shared as much as possible. We are pleased to welcome visitors from Tanzania on an annual basis which is a wonderful way to learn about the wider world.



### Sport, Music and Drama







We love taking part in all types of sporting and musical activities. Each year we put on two school productions and take a trip to the the theatre to see a pantomime. Taking part in the school games is part of our school year and we take part in activities led by Luctonians Rugby Club, Ludlow Football Club and Shrewsbury Town Football Club.

We take part in the local Ludow Netball League with our players excelling both in skill and attitude.

We can offer music lessons with Perepetetic musicians Please let us know if your child would like lessons either in a one to one or group session and we will arrange this.

School starts at 9.00 am but children can arrive from 8.50. In the morning there is a member of staff on the front gate. They will pass messages to class teachers.


